NOTICE TO CUT NOXIOUS WEEDS

If you own or occupy land within the Charter Township of Plymouth, you must cut down or otherwise destroy noxious weeds growing on your property by April 30, 2014, or earlier, if necessary to prevent the noxious weeds from going to seed. If you fail to do so, the Township may hire someone to cut the weeds at your expense. Failure to comply may also subject you to penalties under Michigan law and/or the Township's ordinances.

Noxious weeds include Canada thistle, dodders, mustards, wild carrot, bindweeds, perennial sowthistle, hoary alyssum, ragweed, poison ivy, goldenrod, quack-grass, poison sumac, or any other plants which are recognized as inducing hay fever, rose fever, or other diseases, or as being in any way detrimental to the health or comfort of the community.
