# Orange Barrels Signal Upgrades to Township Roads, Parks



It's been a busy spring with several Township and County infrastructure projects planned or underway. Wayne County is working to resurface Beck Road between Ann Arbor Trail and Five Mile and North Territorial between Beck and Westbrook – two roads that had been deteriorating steadily. In addition, the Township used Federal ARPA funds to rebuild the driveway and main road at Township (McClumpha) Park, and build a new, paved entrance to Hilltop Golf Course off Beck Road – eliminating

potholes and the need for costly grading. The Township is also continuing to connect major sidewalks as part of our three-year, \$2 million 'Sidewalk Gap' project providing improved connectivity between the Township and City for safer and healthier recreation.

#### Township Creates Veterans' Commission Trustee Jen Buckley to Serve as First Chairwoman

Last month, the Township Board formally adopted an Ordinance creating a Veterans' Commission. Up to 9 members of the Commission may be Township residents; Veterans or those committed to Veterans' issues are preferred. The Commission will help foster greater understanding and appreciation for the veteran community and their families, increase visibility of



veterans and veterans' issues, inform the veteran community of available services, programs, and resources, and advocate for issues important to veterans and their families. Trustee Jen Buckley, herself a veteran and Gold Star Spouse, came up with the idea for the Commission and will serve as its first organizing Chairwoman.

Keep Water Rates in Check



# Don't Get Soaked on Water Bills!

By continuing to shift outdoor and indoor water usage activities to the non-peak hours of 12 to 6, you can help control water rates.

#### Does 12 to 6 mean AM or PM?

**Both!** 12 midnight and 6 am is a non-peak time period. If you need to use water during daylight hours, please use water between 12 noon and 6 pm, which is also a non-peak time period in Plymouth Township.

#### When should I water my lawn?

Set your irrigation systems to operate between the designated non-peak hours of 12 midnight and 6 am. If you manually water your lawn, the best time to water is between 12 noon and 6 pm.

#### Are there outdoor water use restrictions?

**No.** You are not being discouraged from outdoor water use. Just keep in mind that using water during non-peak hours can benefit everyone.

### **Mosquito Control**

**Prevention is Key.** Eliminate standing water around your home. Mosquito larvae must live in still water for five or more days to complete their growth. Remove any standing, stagnant water by turning over buckets, toys, etc. that can fill with water. Clean your birdbaths and gutters frequently.

# Feasibility Study for New Lakepointe Fire Station Underway

Fire Station #2 in Lakepointe will be 50 years old in 2026 and is being considered for replacement at its current site on Wilcox Road. Last month, the Township Board authorized the Township administration to prepare a feasibility study for the possible replacement of Station 2 and make recommendations to the Board on the selection of an architect, contractor, engineer, and bond counsel by December 1. The study does not commit the Board of Trustees to a new fire station but will provide them with the needed data to make an informed decision in the future.

### Don't Forget State and Township Fireworks Laws

This Summer and Fall, you may ONLY ignite fireworks on the following days after 11 a.m. on:

- June 29 to July 4 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45 p.m.
- The Saturday and Sunday immediately before Labor Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.

The Township may impose a civil fine of \$1,000.00 for violation of the fireworks ordinance. There are other restrictions on fireworks permits and sales. Please contact the Fire Department at 734-354-3221 for more information.

# Recycling Options Abound in Township!

Plymouth Township is a leader in recycling! In addition to our weekly curbside recycling program, shred days and household hazardous waste weeks, we also offer these additional voluntary recycling options:

- **Battery Recycling:** residents can drop-off household batteries at the Public Services counter on the second floor of Township Hall. This is for dry cell household batteries only. NO lithium, lithium ion, or corroded batteries.
- Fabric and Houseware Recycling: Simple Recycling collects textile and small used home goods at your home. Schedule a pick-up online at www.simplerecycling.com or call them at 866-835-5068.
- Household Food Waste Recycling: Midtown Composting offers Township residents a discount on your setup fee and the first month of composting. Please visit www.midtowncomposting.com and use coupon code "Plymouth" to sign up.
